- **Claire Kellett** almost never strikes out (0% K rate over 33 PA) – pitch to soft contact, not around her.
- **Addison Beach** walks 20% of the time (35 PA) – very patient, attack the zone early rather than nibbling.
- **Austyn Smith** is an extreme ground-ball hitter (73% of balls in play) – tighten the infield when she’s up.

Carolina Elite 14u Culbertson: Team Tendencies

- **Base stealing is a major weapon:** 40 attempts across 15 games (2.7/game) at a 85% success rate. Prioritize quick catcher pop times and varied pitcher hold times.
- **Rarely bunts** — no need to creep the infield corners in for bunt defense.

Ordered by a blended on-base/power/strikeout score ($OBP \times 0.5 + SLG \times 0.3 - K\% \times 0.2$), with the single highest-slugging bat pulled into the cleanup (4th) slot. Players below the plate-appearance threshold, and any names listed in *exclude_batters*, are left off.

Against this opponent, control matters more than usual. Carolina Elite 14u Culbertson steals at a 85% success rate — every walk and wild pitch is a near-certain stolen base. Lucy Calla's walk rate (14%) and wild-pitch rate (7%) make her the safer choice here.

Auto-Generated Strategy Notes

1. **Claire Kellett** almost never strikes out (0% K rate over 33 PA) — pitch to soft contact, not around her.
2. **Addison Beach** walks 20% of the time (35 PA) — very patient, attack the zone early rather than nibbling.
3. **Austyn Smith** is an extreme ground-ball hitter (73% of balls in play) — tighten the infield when she's up.
4. **Base stealing is a major weapon**: 40 attempts across 15 games (2.7/game) at a 85% success rate. Prioritize quick catcher pop times and varied pitcher hold times.
5. **Rarely bunts** — no need to creep the infield corners in for bunt defense.

Stats pulled from each team's full public GameChanger play-by-play logs. Batter identity recovered from free-text play descriptions rather than the scraper's own (unreliable) batter-tracking column. Sample sizes are typically 20–100 PA per player — enough to see real tendencies, not enough to treat any single number as certain, especially under ~20 PA.
